Anna's Less Snowy Lesson

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SCRIPTURE

"Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow."

Isaiah 1:18

In a cozy village nestled among snowy mountains, there was a girl named Anna. Anna loved winter because it meant snow-covered hills, snowball fights, and building snowmen. THE LESSON
